# How can I apply to register?

There are 4 pathways to becoming a HSCPOA registrant: see which one is right for you.\*

Path 1:

### Ontario education

I am (or will be) a graduate of an accredited PSW program in Ontario.

- I can show my PSW diploma/certificate and transcript for a PSW program completed on or after July 1, 2014<sup>1</sup>, from a school board, college or Indigenous institution.

<sup>1</sup> If you completed an Ontario PSW program before July 1, 2014, and have worked as a PSW in the last 3 years, you may be eligible to apply via path 2.

Path 2:

### Ontario work experience

I have worked as a PSW in Ontario in the last 3 years.

My employer has completed a [Confirmation of Employment & PSW Skills form](#) for me, and confirms that:

- I have worked 600+ hours.
- OR**
- I can show my diploma/certificate and transcript or other documentation for a PSW training program that was 600+ hours.

Path 3:

### Labour mobility

I am registered and have worked as a PSW in a Canadian province or territory outside Ontario in the last 3 years.

- I can provide a [Letter of Standing](#) from a Canadian health care aid or continuing care assistant registry or directory.

Path 4:

### Competency assessment

I am not currently eligible for another registration pathway, but have completed a PSW program outside Ontario that was at least 600 hours.

- I can show my diploma/certificate and transcript or other documentation for a PSW training program that was 600+ hours.

**TO QUALIFY, APPLICANTS MUST:**

- Meet education or experience requirements
- Communicate in English or French
- Be of good character
- Show a letter of good standing from any other regulatory body (if applicable).
